Instructions

Students will all be assigned a historical figure from United States History to research and present to other Great Hearts students.

- Students will need to complete the attached form by using a non-fiction book or reputable online resource that provides adequate information about their person of interest, such as a biography.
- Students will use the attached form to create an essay introducing themselves as the historical figure and sharing information about themselves.
- Students will memorize and present their information to their classmates. It is expected that students memorize enough information to speak for 2-5 minutes about their historical figures without looking at notes.
- The historical figure will become more life-like by the students wearing a costume that can easily fit over their standard uniform. Students should also have a small sign or placard with their historical figure's name on it.
- This project will count towards next quarter's history grade and should be completed with much care.



• Please be creative with your costume and sign as well as working diligently to memorize the facts. We love creativity, and value the students' honest effort in making this project great!
