## **Project Requirements**

#### Part 1 - Research

Research Ancient Roman architecture focusing on the famous Roman structure you have been assigned. Use the guided questions and list of recommended sources, found on the following page, to assist you in your research. Then fill out the research page.

#### Part 2 - Write

Write a two-paragraph report using your research as a guide. The first paragraph will be about Roman architecture and the second paragraph will focus on your specific structure. Each paragraph must have at least 5 sentences and answer the guided questions. The report should be handwritten using your best cursive handwriting.

#### Part 3 - Create

Create a three dimensional visual representation of the architectural feature. Your project must be no bigger than 24 in by 18 in because it will be displayed on your desk. Visual examples are provided on the following page.

#### Part 4 - Present

Give a 2-5 minute presentation about your project to the class. Your report must be memorized. Students may use one notecard to reference during their presentation.
